Soap "Sacks" - A Personal Ministry

All Saints parishioner, Gussie Lewis, handcrafts soap "sacks" to include with the gifts for the ladies to the women's shelter. Read about this special ministry below, and how and why Gussie got involved.

The vision of **Soap S.A.C.K.** (Supporting a Community with Kindness – <u>soapsacks.com</u>) is to inspire communities of volunteers around the world to crochet/knit, collect, and donate soap and soap sacks to their local food pantries, homeless centers, veterans clinics, social service agencies and relief efforts. These sacks can be used as a washcloth and to store the soap, and are made from cotton so they are soft.

Why soap? The founder of Soap S.A.C.K., Stacy Wiener, had volunteered at local food pantries and realized that people were not able to use government subsidies such as food stamps to buy toiletry items. She saw a need and began designing these absorbent cotton knit bags.



Each bag holds a new bar of soap and can be hung out to dry between uses while keeping the soap bar clean.

After seeing Stacy Wiener interviewed, I became inspired, and I've been making soap sacks for 3 years now. The first year I was only able to complete 25, but this year I was able to make 70 sacks! I try to make each sack unique and beautiful by using a different colored yarn.


I feel blessed to be able to make something that I know is well-received and will help others!

Each month, All Saints is committed to providing the SHARE boxes with meats and vegetables to the community we serve through *Little Lights*. We recently dropped off 25 boxes of groceries, which included eggs and frozen turkeys. They were all gone within fifteen minutes!

Here is the feedback we received from our friends at Little Lights:



A parent from Hopkins (housing complex) said, "Thank you for being such a huge blessing to our community. If I had \$5, I would give \$2.50 of it to Little Lights."

Your generous donations allow us to continue feeding those who are struggling to provide for their families. The SHARE boxes cost \$25 each. We are currently distributing 25 boxes per month but would like to see that number increase. Please PRAY with us specifically that this outreach program will grow this year so we can serve more than twenty-five hurting families per month.
